

Second Sunday of Lent

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Lent, immediately after the narrative of the temptation of Jesus, the Church invites us to meditate on the narrative of Jesus' transfiguration. The Gospel says Jesus took Peter, James, and John, his brother, with him and led them up a high mountain. We know that the mountain is a theological theme dear to Mathew. In this particular context, the theophany of the Sinai is renewed on the mountain of the transfiguration. A humble mountain in Galilee witnesses the glory of the humble carpenter of Nazareth. Jesus was giving them a taste of His glory to come to forearm them against the scandal of His abasement.

Again, the Gospel says, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am pleased; listen to him." This divine voice renews the revelation already made at the Baptism of Jesus; Jesus is more than a man; he is the one and Beloved son. Lord, in this privileged season of Lent, help us to really listen to you with all seriousness, as we listen to messages that we know to be important to us. Each of our Eucharists is like a refreshing stopover on the mountain with Jesus.

This experience of the transfiguration provides us with a model of discipleship—a combination of wisdom and humility: of wisdom to know what is visible, of humility to remember that there is even more that we do not understand. Parents need this model. They are charged to share their wisdom with their children. They are charged to warn their children about what they feel is harmful and to guide them to the decisions which they see as the best decisions. But, even as they exercise that wisdom for the sake of their children, parents must remember that there is a part of every child which they do not see, a part that is only now emerging. Parents must respect that part; it is the only way in which their children will grow to be the persons God wants them to be.

Jesus was changed on the mount of transfiguration. We can change through the power of God. Even though we have failed to change in the past, today is a new possibility, because today Jesus reaches out to transfigure us.

The glory revealed today should serve as the "activation energy" that motivates us to continue walking towards our final destination. The journey is not yet over, and truly, not an easy one. However, Christ is with us. He encourages and tells us, "Do not be afraid!"
